# 3. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

#### 3.1 President's Report

Jonathan Morris, WHA President, presented the annual report to participants. Highlighting a significant achievement in 2022-23 was the growth in the WHA community. Six new hospitals joined during 2022-23 financial year with four more joining since September 2023. WHA membership now makes up more than 83% of public births.

He then outlined key activities related to the following WHA strategic priorities:

# Partnering with women in design and delivery of care

WHA continues to share webinars showcasing initiatives with co-design and consumer involvement at the centre. Four notable presentations from around the country were partically highlighted.

Consumer involvement is also present in all levels of the National Preterm Birth Prevention Collaborative. This includes hearing from lived experiences at learning sessions, sharing resources to support shared decision-making, and learning from consumers about barriers to the implementation of cervical screening and progesterone prescribing.

# Enhancing value through benchmarking

WHA has a robust benchmarking program which includes

- Activity and costing data to help services provide cost-effective high-value care
- **Clinical Benchmarking** reports include data from over 186,000 births allowing WHA members to measure their progress overtime and compare themselves with peers.
- **MGP benchmarking** compares MGP with standard care, and MGP models with each other separated by risk.
- **Online data portal** with a rich dataset of de-identified clinical episodes of care from more than 650,000 women and newborns to understand outcomes for women of similar characteristics.

# Networking to share excellence and innovation.

WHA continues to share innovations making a difference to outcomes for women and their newborns. 2022-23 saw over 2610 maternity professionals attending 37 virtual networking

meetings. Highlights included the Leading Thinkers Series and Improving Value in Healthcare Series which include learnings from peers about ways to provide appropriate safe and effective care. WHA's online community connects over 4400 experts in maternal and newborn care, including access to more than 200 video presentations. The online community and associated networking meetings are accessible to all individuals at member hospitals.

# **Collaborative Quality Improvement**

WHA in partnership with the Australian Preterm Birth Alliance is conducting the 'Every Week Counts: National Preterm Birth Collaborative' to safely reduce preterm & early term birth in participating hospitals by 20% by March 2024.

Over 60 maternity hospitals are working together to prevent preterm birth with incredible teamwork between participating hospital sites and supporting partner organisations.

#### Advocating for a healthy and sustainable future

WHA continues to advocate for sustainable delivery of healthcare, through promoting examples of sustainable healthcare initiatives that are eliminating waste and decarbonising services to reduce the impact of climate change on the health of women and their newborns.

#### **3.2 Financial Report**

Johnathan Morris then gave an overview of the audited financial report, highlighting that the increased income and expenses were largely due to Commonwealth funding for the Collaborative.

He then closed the report by thanking the WHA board of directors, WCHA team, and WHA member hospitals.
